

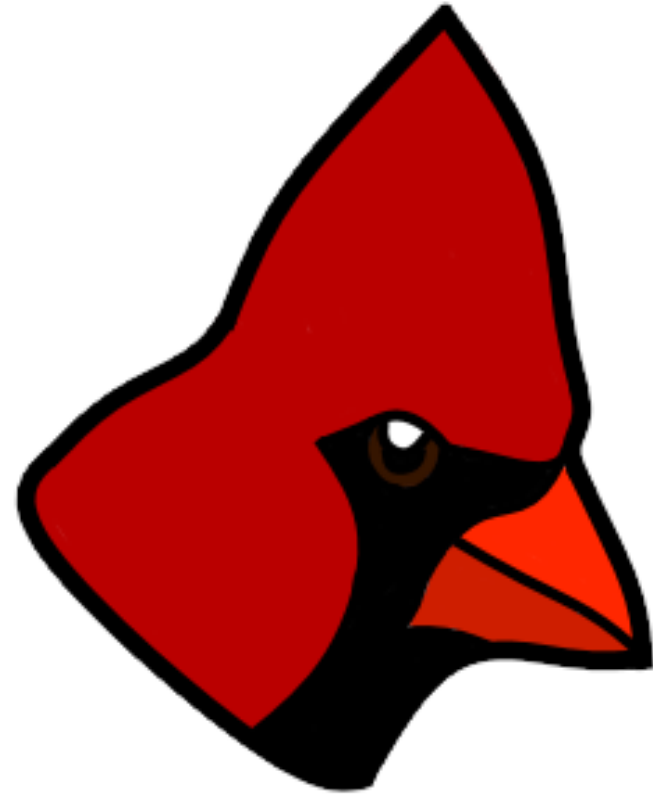
# WHOSE BEAK IS THAT?



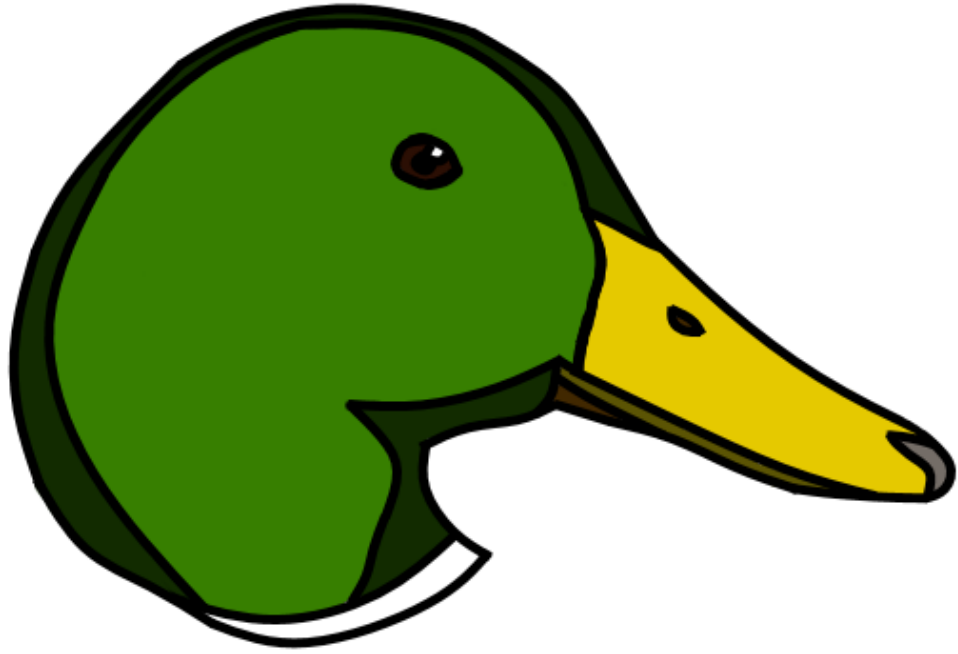
See if you can match the different beaks with the type of food that bird eats! After, go outside and find a bird for each beak type!



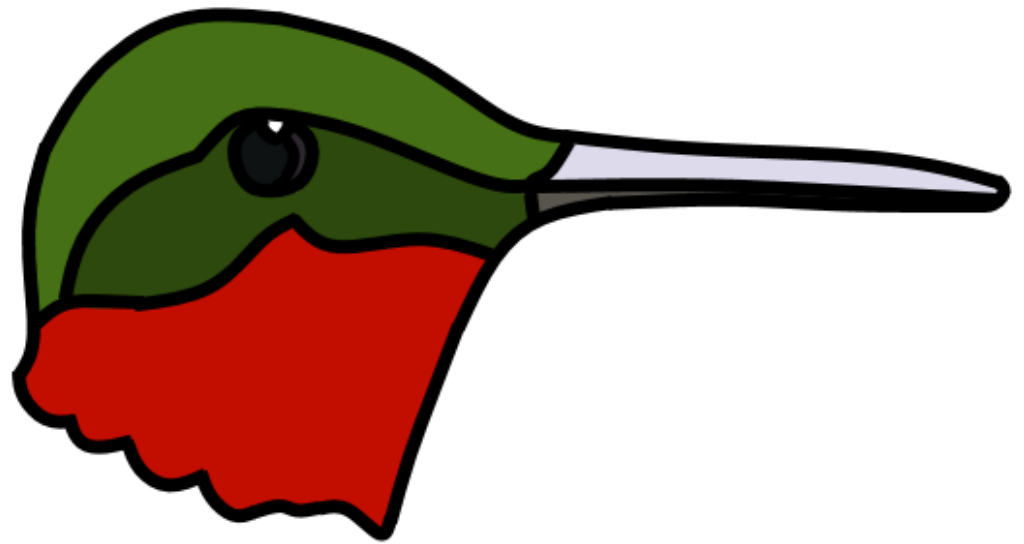

## BEAK TYPES

**Meat-Eating** - Thick and sharply hooked for cutting meat (Example: Hawks, Eagles, Falcons)

**Nectar-Eating** - Narrow and pointed for getting into flowers (Example: Hummingbirds)

**Probing** - Long and curved for digging into sand (Example: Shorebirds)

**Siphoning** - Flat and wide to siphon food from water (Example: Ducks, Geese, Swans)

**Insect-Catching** - Small and narrow for catching insects (Example: Warblers, Kinglets)

**Seed-Eating** - Thick and cone-like for crushing seeds (Example: Sparrows, Finches, Cardinals)

**Wood-pecking** - Long and thick for pecking at trees to get to the insects (Example: Woodpeckers)

**Fish-Catching** - Long and hooked for catching and holding fish (Example: Cormorants)
