**Location:** Haliburton, Hastings, Peterborough, Lennox-Addington, or Muskoka

**Employment type:** This role can be a Full Time Seasonal (35 hrs/week) position for candidates qualifying for Youth Employment Strategy subsidies between the ages of 15 and 30, or Part Time at 15-20 hours per week for candidates over the age of 30 years old.

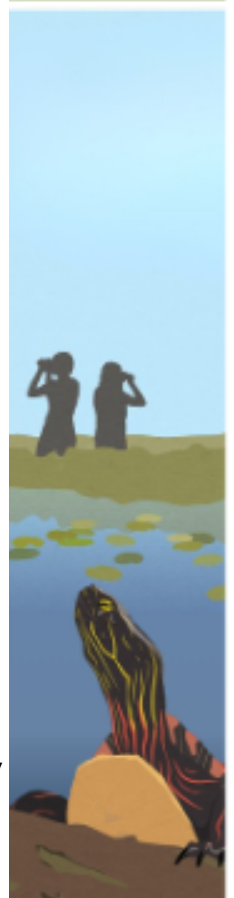
**Rate of pay:** \$23.00 - \$26.00/hour depending on experience

## JOB DESCRIPTION

The Land Between is searching for a dynamic and passionate applicant for the Blue Lakes Project Coordinator position. The incumbent will work with an expert steering committee to guide the development and uptake of a new lake stewardship program, including lake monitoring. You will work closely with community Lake Associations to choose and tailor stewardship goals and actions for participants that support lake health and natural shorelines, and will work alongside communities and participants to advance their efforts and success in areas related to invasive species management, monitoring, restoration, and education. You will train public members in using monitoring tools, and provide educational presentations on lake health. You will work with GIS data and be able to analyze results and create reports for the public and partners. The Project Manager will be available to the public to answer questions, conduct site visits and lead lake health and educational events such as "Bugs in the Mud". You will also take part in our shoreland and pollinator garden project and assist in designing native gardens for landowners in the community, including municipal partners. You will be part of a team to strategically grow the program and achieve greater conservation of lake health across the region, including using behaviour change science, designing of ecolabels, leveraging partnerships and branding, marketing, media and grant writing.



## Position Requirements

- Actively pursuing or completed post secondary in a relevant field (Ecosystem Management, Conservation, Environmental Science, Outdoor Education etc)
- Possess an active G or G1 license
- must be eligible for Canada Summer Jobs (Between 15-30 years of age and a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person to whom refugee protection has been conferred under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act for the duration of the employment)

## Skills

- Knowledge of limnology, fisheries, and aquatic habitats including native plants.
- Strong communication, emotional intelligence, and presentation skills
- Strategic management, time management and organizational skills
- Proficiency in writing and data input, computer skills including excel, some knowledge of GIS, etc.
- Personal integrity, accountability, and transparency to be able to work in teams and yet strong leadership and program management skills, with transparency in order to communicate effectively with a steering committee and report to the COO, as well as work independently.
